Last month, Carmeuse Mauritania donated 4,235 schoolbooks to Wharf Elementary School, providing 354 girls and 458 boys with essential educational resources.

In the long run, we also hope to encourage a sense of responsibility as the students will need to look after these books so that they can be passed on to younger children.
