What's happened @ CMO

Volunteer medical caravan brings vital care to villages







In July and August, we collectively walked, ran, and

hiked 6 741,65 kilometres.

1 month left to go so let's make it count!

On August 29 and 30, 2025, Carmeuse Mauritania, with NGO (and long-term partner) SOS Diabetes, organized a medical caravan to the villages of Wapounde and Thide near Bogué. This initiative brought together 12 nurses and, an impressive, 28 doctors, all volunteering their time and equipment to deliver much-needed medical care to the region

Over two days, the team provided 517 medical consultations — including ophthalmology, paediatrics, general medicine, and gynaecology — while also running awareness campaigns on malaria and diabetes. Essential supplies were distributed, with 550 hygiene kits and 250 mosquito nets reaching local families. Volunteers worked tirelessly from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., assisting in three challenging births and seeing patients, some of whom had waited over a year to see a doctor.

SOS Diabetes ensured all volunteers were well-fed, while a local mayor arranged accommodation — free of charge. The event concluded with a detailed report, which will be presented to local government officials to advocate for improved healthcare access in the area. Unsurprisingly, this impactful initiative was featured in the local news!
