Strengthening Community Well-Being in Senegal

Two important awareness initiatives were recently carried out in Bandia, Senegal, each aimed at improving the well-being of children and supporting long-term community development.

As part of the malnutrition prevention program, food supplies were delivered to support children in the area. In collaboration with project partners, practical measures have been planned for 2026 to further improve the community's access to nutritious food.

In parallel, a meeting with a reproductive health expert and the principal of Bandia High School laid the groundwork for establishing a new Family Life Education Club.

This club will serve as a platform for student-led awareness activities on topics such as hygiene, reproductive health, menstrual management, and school-related challenges.

The initiative is designed to encourage young people to exchange best practices, learn from older peers, promote social integration within both school and family settings, and nurture a culture of giving back to the community.
