Côte d'Ivoire's new veggie garden

We're excited to share the launch of our newest CMO plant vegetable garden in Côte d'Ivoire! The project is driven by the energy and teamwork of the entire CMCI team, who are working together to build and care for the garden.

A variety of crops have been planted, including carrots, tomatoes, aubergines (eggplants), cucumbers, parsley, peppers, manioc, banana trees, and papaya. Each crop has a dedicated team member looking after it, helping it grow strong and healthy.

Once harvested, the produce will be sold to local partners at affordable prices, making fresh food more accessible. The money raised will be used to grow the garden further and support future projects, creating a simple and sustainable cycle.
